

Dear Church Family,

This past Sunday, June 14, was WONDERFUL! It was the first time that we, as a church family, were able to enter the church building and worship the Lord together since March. When 2020 began on January 1, I would never had considered the possibility that we would be instructed not to come to worship with other members of our church family. Thankfully, this has passed.

As I write this, I have finished my message for this coming Sunday a few minutes ago. The passage from Colossians I am preaching from finds Paul challenging the Colossians to not be taken in by the false teachers' rhetoric. With this still on my mind, I wish to deal in a brief fashion with something that's happening in Christianity today. First, however, I want you to read a couple brief passages from Paul's pen. Now the Spirit expressly says that in later times some will depart from the faith by devoting themselves to deceitful spirits and teachings of demons, and Don't let anyone deceive you in any way. For [that day] will not come unless the apostasy comes first and the man of lawlessness is revealed, the son of destruction (2 Thessalonians 2:3, HCSB). Both of these passages tell us a similar truth: that the last days is going to revel a wholesale departure from the Christian faith. Some will substitute "the teachings of demons" while there will be an "apostacy" or "a great falling away" (NKJV). If we were in the apostacy and a period when people were embracing the teaching of demons, what should we expect to find? Here are a few things but there are others to be sure. 1) I would expect to see the deemphasizing of biblical teaching. This is everywhere and in all Christian denominations. On many church web sites, it is a struggle to find any doctrinal statements. And if you find it, it is basic and generic. 2) I would expect to find a lack of biblical fidelity among professing Christian. By this, I have in mind the lack of biblical convictions. Decisions of where to attend church is not based on what the church teaches, but on items like musical styles, Bible translation choices, or church sponsored activities. Basically, the attitude of "What can this church offer me?" 3). I would expect to see compromise of professing Christians with the world. I know, this is likely to ruffle feathers. I saw this today and, quite frankly, it left me stunned (https://popculture.com/country-music/news/florida-georgia-line-join-christian-artist-chris-tomlin-nashvilleshow/, check this article out). I did not know who Florida/Georgia Line was, but I do know who Chris Tomlin is. I love his music – I still do. But after reading the lyrics of some of the songs of Florida/Georgia Line – they have no business being on the same stage. WAIT – before you tar and feather me, read what the Bible says: 17 Now this I say and testify in the Lord, that you must no longer walk as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their minds. 18 They are darkened in their understanding, alienated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them, due to their hardness of heart. ¹⁹ They have become callous and have given themselves up to sensuality, greedy to practice every kind of impurity. ²⁰ But that is not the way you learned Christ! And John writes: 15 Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. 16 For all that is in the world – the desires of the flesh and the desires of the eyes and pride of life – is not from the Father but is from the world. ¹⁷ And the world is passing away along with its desires, but whoever does the will of God abides forever. I can cite many more passages that are in agreement with these.

Finally, 4) If we are in the last days, I would expect to see Christians defend and minimize sin. Yes, this is happening with professing Christians in defending abortion, homosexuality, and even looting; excusing all three of these (and many more). To top it all off, heroes of professing Christians today are not Lottie Moon, Annie Armstrong, Adoniram Judson, Jonathan Edwards, Hudson Taylor, or David Brainard. No, today the heroes are celebrities that profess being Christians (too many of whom have renounced faith in Christ), My opinion — we are living in the last days.

So what should we do? Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you.

COVID-19, racism, sexual sin, sexual confusion, oppression, lies, idolatry, the love of money, evil... cannot be fixed by the government.

No one in the House of Representatives nor the Senate will fix us. No one in local government will fix us. Protestors to the government will not fix us. No celebrity endorsement will fix us. President Donald Trump will not fix us. Whoever he appoints to any level of the court, will not fix us. Only God can fix what plagues our country by His saving grace through the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Can God use anyone listed above, absolutely, just the same as He can use you and me to accomplish His purposes, but we must first seek His Kingdom and His righteousness.

We must seek the Lord and ask Him what He wants from His servants, and no one else. Just as Joshua did before the battle of Jericho at the end of Joshua 5, when the Commander of the Lord's Army reminded Joshua that the only side the Lord is on, is His side. Our focus must be on Him first and then everything else will come into line.

Only true repentance from His people, "His People," not everyone else, will help. His Word expresses this in 2 Chronicles 7:14. God is looking for the people who claim to be His followers to repent. He is not looking for us to blame others. Humility, nor repentance are shown by blaming others. If we truly believe in the power of the gospel. If we truly believe that our Lord can and will bring revival, then we need to seek Him by turning from our own evil ways to His way.

As we await His return, His request is that when He returns, He finds us doing what we are supposed to be doing, just as His Word tells us in Luke 12:35-40. His request is that upon His return, that we are found working for Him and living our lives for Him alone. His request is not for us to just sit around and talk about it.

As Pastor Johnny Hunt says, "Too much talky talky, not enough walky walky," is taking place by those who claim to be followers of Jesus.

If we truly believe, then we need to show it by living our lives each and every moment like we truly believe.



Trustees' Report for July

Two new items which the trustees will be discussing and bringing before the church for consideration include a new HVAC system for Room 101 and additional security cameras to cover some blind spots which the other security cameras do not cover.

10 Reasons Many Churches Aren't Friendly to Guest by Chuck Lawless

I've <u>previously written about findings of "church secret shoppers"</u> we've used in church consulting. One of those findings is that many churches aren't very friendly to guests. Here are some of the reasons that's the case:

- 1. Caveat: Churches *are* friendly, but only to people they already know. That's why churches almost always assert how friendly they are, and guests often talk of how friendly they *aren't*.
- **2.** No one's ever evaluated them. I've never talked to a church who told me how unfriendly they are. On the other hand, they've never really tested that conclusion by seeking input from guests—particularly, the guests *who never return*.
- **3.** Congregations don't even know each other. The reality is that most members have a small circle of friends in the church, and they don't know many people beyond that circle. If they aren't really in relationship with other church members, it's not surprising that they don't reach out to guests.
- **4.** They leave the "friendliness" responsibility to others. After all, they think, the extroverts and the talkers are wired for that task. When the greeters are doing their job, other members shouldn't have to worry about it.
- **5.** They haven't fostered life-on-life Christianity. Honestly, I'm not convinced that many believers understand what Christian hospitality and friendship are. Our relationships are generally surface-level, Sunday-to-Sunday "friendships." It's little wonder we're not that friendly to people we don't even know.
- **6.** Congregations treat church as if it's all about them. They worship only where they like the style. They church shop any time their needs aren't met. They protect their positions and their turf, and they use language like "my church." Self-centeredness seldom fosters friendliness.
- 7. They've built their "friendly moment" into the worship service. Thom Rainer has shown some of the problems with this approach, but many churches still have a forced "stand and greet" time during the service. When you know that time's coming, you don't need to reach out to anyone before the service.
- **8.** They focus on their primary friends since they see them only once a week. This issue goes back to #5 in this list. When you spend little intentional time with other believers outside of church, you give most of your attention to your friends when you do gather,
- **9.** Their primary leader isn't perceived as friendly, either. The longer a pastor is the leader, the more likely it is the church will adopt his personality. A perceived unfriendly pastor will produce an unfriendly church.
- 10. They don't have many guests anyway, so they have little practice. Thus, the process comes full circle. An unfriendly church sees few guests return, and the congregation eventually becomes desensitized to inviting guests or greeting them when they come.
